The closure of the education system impacted over 55 million students in public, private, and charter schools, colleges, and universities. This sudden disruption inflicted tremendous social and economic costs that have yet to be fully realized.

School closures have turned a spotlight on the inequities and other shortcomings... because schools are closed, parents and the general public have become more aware than any other time in my memory of the inequities in children's lives outside of school...in this situation, we don't simply want to frantically struggle to restore the status quo, because the status quo wasn't operating at an effective level and certainly wasn't serving all of our children fairly. Right now, more than ever, there is a real opportunity to make things right for the future...shutting down should not be an option. We have to find some middle ground, and that means the state and local school districts are going to have to act urgently and nimbly to fill in the gaps in technology and internet access. \$9

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Initially, many schools shut down completely and began to conduct classes via remote learning. As the term suggests, remote learning is where the student and the educator, or information source, are not physically present in a traditional classroom environment; information is relayed through technology, such as discussion boards, video conferencing, and online assessments.

Administrators are currently working on the design and implementation of new systems to get students back in the classroom. Due to financial and resource disparities between districts, schools, and individual students, these systems will need to be engineered to accommodate these disparities.


